of Science in Business Administration (Major in Marketing Management) and Bachelor of Science in Hotel and Restaurant Management. This survey headed by Dr. Marcela T. Caluscasin took place last November 7-9.

On the other hand, the Bachelor of Elementary Education, Bachelor of Secondary Education, and Bachelor of Industrial Education

programs underwent Level IV accreditation last November 13-17. This was led by Dr. Manuel T. Corpus, Consultant and Dr. Thelma T. Lanuza, Overall Coordinator.

Two students of TSU competed in the Association of Universities of Asia and the Pacific (AUAP) English Speech Competition and Youth camp held last November 22-26, 2017 at the Siam University in Bangkok, Thailand.

Frances Sharina Gonzales, an AB Communication student, finished fifth among 60 international student delegates who joined the competition. BSEd English student John Benedict Canlas on the other hand finished 9th.

In Round 1 of the

competition, the contestants were required to deliver a five (5) minute prepared speech in English with the theme "Cross Culture Dialogues and Sustainable Development Goals".

Round 2 required the contestants to make a 5-minute impromptu speech based on a topic given to each participant five minutes before addressing the audience. In the final round, the contestants were required to do the same, but this time the topics came from the judges.

Gonzales said that she

was grateful and happy for the experience. A last minute replacement to join the event, Gonzales said that were it not for the encouragement of her Dean from the College of Arts and Social Sciences, Dr. Agnes M. Macaraeg, she and her co-delegate John Benedict would not have performed well.

The Speech competition ended with a trip and a three day, two night stay for all delegates and participants in Pattaya, where they learned more about Thai culture and enjoyed the sightseeing tour.
